From the Pastor's Pen

Happy New Year...Some Day

"The Lord said to Moses and Aaron in the land of Egypt: This month shall mark for you the beginning of months; it shall be the first month of the year for you." –Exodus 12:1-2



New Year's Day isn't something that we question too often. December is the twelfth month and January is the first so *naturally* we celebrate the New Year on January 1, right? The month of January was actually invented by Numa Pompilius, the second king of Rome who reigned from 715-673 BC. The previous Roman calendar only had ten months so he added *Ianuarius* and *Februarius* to the end of the calendar. Though we don't know why, he changed his mind and decided that January would come

first – and so it has been since around 713 BC. When Julius Caesar reformed the calendar by edict in 46 BC, he kept the New Year right where it was. When Pope Gergory XIII reformed the calendar once more in 1582, he reduced the number of leap years, changed the number of days to 365.25, and let January 1st stand to this day.

The Eastern Orthodox Church celebrates the circumcision of Jesus on January 1st, but New Year's Day isn't really a religious holiday for the rest of us. Yet, we can see from our verses from Exodus that the Bible does talk about the new year as a day that is instituted by God. From context, you may be able to guess when that day is – the first day of Passover. Passover is the celebration of God's liberating miracles in the Exodus from Egypt. Since the Jewish calendar differs from the Gregorian Calendar that we use, Passover generally falls some time in March or April. But wait, there's more – in Leviticus 23 and Numbers 29, the Bible talks about a Festival of Trumpets, which modern Jews celebrate as the new year (in September or October).

Throughout history, the year has been new in many different ways and, certainly, at many different times. In the middle ages, Christians celebrated new year's on – to name a few dates – March 1st, March 25th, Easter Sunday, September 1st, and December 25th. What is important is for us to remember that any of us can begin again. Maybe one of the days already mentioned feels like an anchoring point of your life – maybe there is another day that is special to you. Either way, our resurrection hope is that new life springs from the heart of God. In the book of Revelation, we hear familiar words from Jesus: "See, I am making all things new." As we journey into 2017, let us keep this comfort, this challenge ever before our eyes. Jesus daily works miracles within us and through us and before our eyes. May we have eyes to see and ears to ear!

When I got close to the mom and baby, I introduced myself as the Children's Minister, and with hope and expectation I asked the mother if her baby could participate in our Christmas program. This mother willingly committed to this. She seemed excited for her little one to be able to participate as baby Jesus. My heart was leaping as God had provided, he had answered my prayer.


A couple of weeks had passed, with much program preparation underway. I had been burning the candle at both ends, striving so to have a quality production. I had gone into my room to take a little rest. I began praying out loud. During this prayer, I had a random thought and began thinking about the fact that Bryan and I had been wanting to take in foster children. We had tried on several occasions to take the foster parenting classes, but with Bryan's travel for work schedule, this became about impossible. With a little frustration in my heart I cried out, "Lord if there's a baby who needs our help, we'll take it!" I stopped, and thought to myself, "Where did that come from? A baby? I never thought we'd take in a baby. Babies are for the young!" I later chuckled as I shared with Bryan what I had prayed. His simple response was, "Well, that would be ok with me."


Another week went by and we were in set building mode at the church, when I received a phone call from this young mother (of our baby Jesus) asking us to take her baby into our home. DHS had given her 24 hours to find a placement before they would find a foster home. I told her, "Absolutely!" When I got off the phone with her, I realized that I hadn't asked my husband. I quickly called him and his answer to me was, "Absolutely!" Within a few hours on December 8, 2014 this precious little 2-month old infant moved into our home.

During the last 2 years, we continued on a path of expectation and preparation, just as the birth of Christ was only the beginning of what was to and what is still to come. This journey has contained joy and sadness. The Lord provided needed and unexpected heroes along the way. It has not been easy, yet once again our hearts leap for joy as the Lord answered our many prayers. This child has recently become our very own.

Our journey now continues........ as our journey continues, I challenge you, my friends to consider your journey. What are you reminded of that the Lord has prepared you for and has brought you through? What are your expectations as you consider this Christmas season? The season in which God sent hope for all of the World! Merry Christmas!

God came down to live with us so that we could live like him. God came down to save us from violence by showing us the way of peace.


To save us from greed by showing us the way of compassion.
