

At the Session retreat this month, our attention was drawn to the mosaic cross that hangs in the window of the Trinity Café. One of the elders pointed to a colored glass chip, and said, "that one's mine!" It was then that I learned another important story of our church, the creation of the mosaic cross – that many of our church had placed "their" chip of colored glass into the mix, preserving its color and shape while being linked into the overall shape of the cross.

What a beautiful metaphor for the church!

Each of us individually are like the chips of glass – uniquely formed, with our own beautiful perspective and shape. But we also are part of something greater than ourselves – we are a part of the body of Christ. Like the mosaic cross, we find ourselves in times of light, in times of shadow, and in times when the darkness falls for longer than we'd like. But through it all, we too are held closely by the love and care of God.

Before the mosaic cross hardened into its current shape, each chip of glass was immersed into the clear resin, just as each of us have been spiritually immersed in the triune God through our baptism.

Think of Jesus' baptism, when John immersed him in the water of the Jordan river, and as he arose from the river, God spoke out: "This is my beloved Son, who brings me great joy!" (Matt 3:17) Whenever we remember our baptism, we remember that as a part of the body of Christ, we too are beloved children of God, who bring God great joy.

Now, as the mosaic cross hangs in the café, we see that the light that shines through it bursts into a riot of color, reminding us of both the rainbow of God's promise to the world through Noah (Gen 9) and, with a little imagination, the tongues of flame that appeared with the disciples fifty days after Jesus' resurrection. On that Pentecost, the tongues of flames showed that the disciples were able to speak the tongues of humanity – everyone gathered heard their own language, whether the disciples spoke it or not. (Acts 2) Likewise, the light that passes through the mosaic cross changes to the color of the chip it passes through – it "speaks" to the chip of glass in its own "language." When we celebrate Pentecost later this month, we remember that God speaks to us too in our own way, calling us to God's redeeming grace.

Together, we are the body of Christ – a picture of unity in diversity.



Finally, be sure to check the signup sheet in the Trinity Café for openings to bring Sunday morning treats during May and June.


