“After this I looked, and there in heaven a door stood open! ...³ And the one seated there looks like jasper and carnelian, and around the throne is a rainbow that looks like an emerald. ⁴ Around the throne are twenty-four thrones, and seated on the thrones are twenty-four elders, dressed in white robes, with golden crowns on their heads. Coming from the throne are flashes of lightning, and rumblings and peals of thunder...and in front of the throne there is something like a sea of glass, like crystal. Around the throne, and on each side of the throne, are four living creatures, ... each of them with six wings, full of eyes all around and inside. Day and night without ceasing they sing,

‘Holy, holy, holy,
the Lord God the Almighty,
who was and is and is to come.’

⁹ And whenever the living creatures give glory and honor and thanks to the one who is seated on the throne, who lives forever and ever, ¹⁰ the twenty-four elders fall before the one who is seated on the throne and worship the one who lives forever and ever; they cast their crowns before the throne, singing,

¹¹ ‘You are worthy, our Lord and God,
to receive glory and honor and power,
for you created all things,
and by your will they existed and were created.’”

Probably each one of us has wondered at some point what heaven will be like – a city? A garden? A forest? Or perhaps something new. The Bible offers us several stunning visions of the glory of heaven. The author of the book of Revelation, John of Patmos, sees a door open and he can peer into heaven. The words that he writes seem to tumble out of him – a great throne, one sitting there, a rainbow that looks like an emerald. What could this mean? What was he really seeing? John gazed into a mystical, unknowable reality and used all the loveliest and most powerful words he could think of. It was like looking at precious stones – no, like a rainbow; no, like the intensity of thunder and lightning; but, no, with the delicate beauty of crystal.

What do we see? What can we know of heaven? We see God at the center. We see angels and saints in exuberant worship. We see joy and light and peace. Who is God? Almighty, there for us past, present and future. Who is God? Worthy of our glory and honor and praise. Who is God? The one who created everything by will alone.

Sometimes we're over-confident that we know all about heaven and God and what we should be doing. Sometimes we're so overwhelmed that we think, "It won't possibly be me, sinner that I am. I don't feel connected to God and I mess up all the time." The awesome power about this vision that John shares with us, and other visions of heaven, is that they blow our over-confidence and under-confidence out of the water! God, Christ, Spirit dwells in mystery, but reaches out to us all the same. We cannot fully know God, but God knows us perfectly – there is not a bit of you that God doesn't know and love. The brightness of this gem/rainbow/lightning reality is being shown to each one of us. Whatever our confusion or uncertainty, why not let's shake it off and sing along with the happy chorus: "Holy, holy, holy, the Lord God the Almighty"!

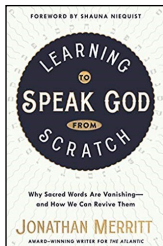

Fall is here and the Mission Team is busy!

School is back in session and that means our Backpacks 4 Bixby program is in full swing. B4B serves children in four Bixby schools who have been identified by their school counselors as being nutritionally at risk. These children receive breakfast and lunch at school during the school week, but on the weekend they do not have access to sufficient food. This is where Trinity steps in! We provide bags of food each weekend for these students. In our food bags we give them a couple of sources of protein, some fruit, a hot or cold cereal and a couple of snacks. Trinity has been doing this mission work for 10 years and we have provided over 12,000 weekend meals to children in the Bixby Public Schools.

The involvement by our community of faith spans all areas of our church and include:

- Delivering Bags

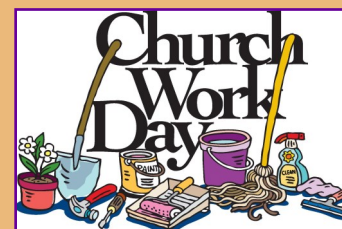

And then there's the weather and the many bugs that insist on climbing into our light fixtures. Here's some things we hope to accomplish:

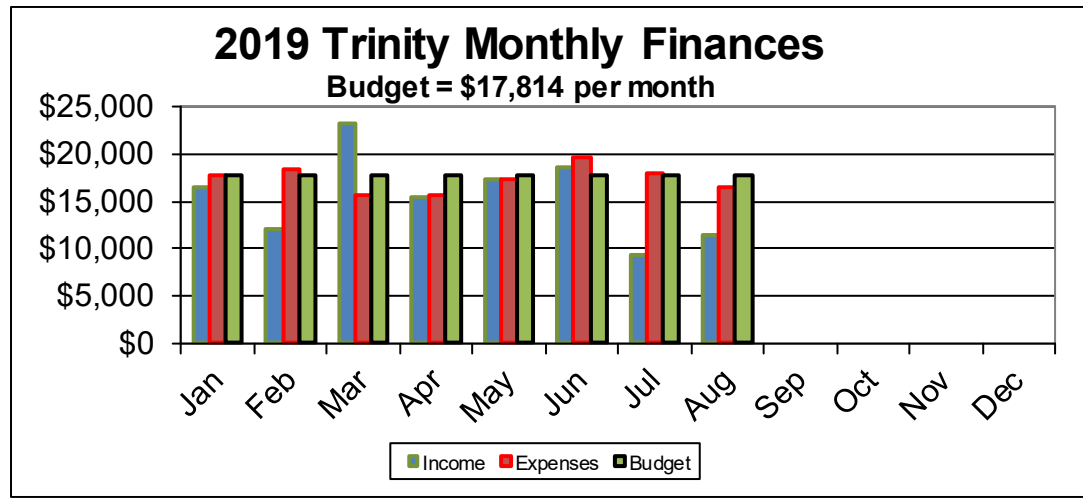
- ◆ Light fixtures cleaned (especially the ones in the café).
